Kristina Puleikienė holds a Bachelor's degree in Management from Klaipėda University in 2001 and a Master's degree in Management and Business Administration from Klaipėda University in 2003. She was awarded a PhD degree from Vilnius University in 2023 after defending her dissertation in Economics in the field of Social sciences.

From 2004 to 2020, she was the Head of the Department of Economics at the Lithuanian Business College and supervised the study programmes in Economics, Business Enterprise Economics and Accounting, and since 2020 she has been the Deputy Director for Studies and Quality.
