



U.S. Higher Education System



- Decentralized, No Ministry of Education
- 4000+ universities and colleges
- Large public universities, small private colleges, specialty schools
- Admissions requirements essays, SAT/ACT, and TOEFL/IELTS
- Test-optional, video applications



Undergraduate Degrees

- Associate Degree (AA, AS) 2 years (community colleges)
- Bachelor's Degree (BA, BS) 4 years



Undergraduate Students

- Apply as a first year student (last year of high school)
- Apply to a community college then transfer to a
 4- year university
- Apply as a transfer student after 1st or 2nd year of university study in home country

"I want to go to the #1 ranked school"




